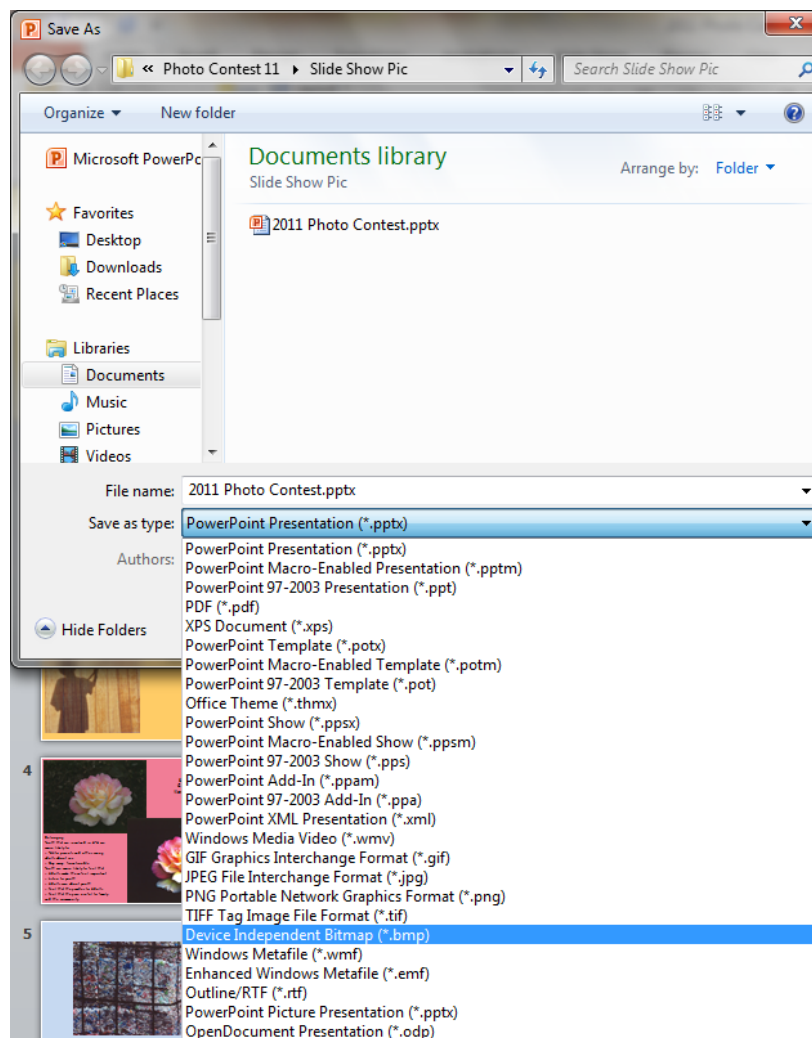


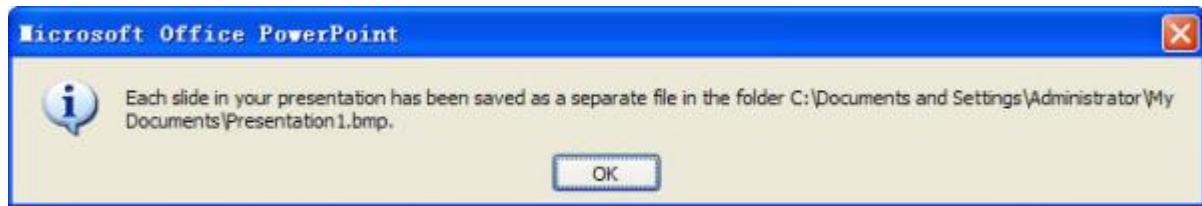
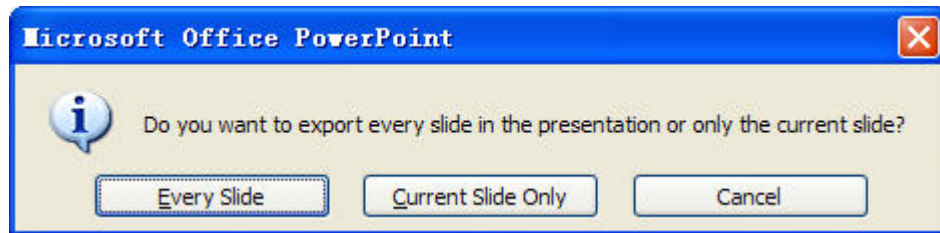
How to Create Screensaver with PowerPoint 2010

Since PowerPoint 2010 provides engaging contents in slides, you might want to decorate your desktop more by using these high-impact presentations as your computer's screensaver. Or maybe you want a screensaver as a reminder of your business mission you worked from company meeting. There's the fast solution to make a screensaver with PowerPoint 2010 and Windows XP. Just follow the steps below:

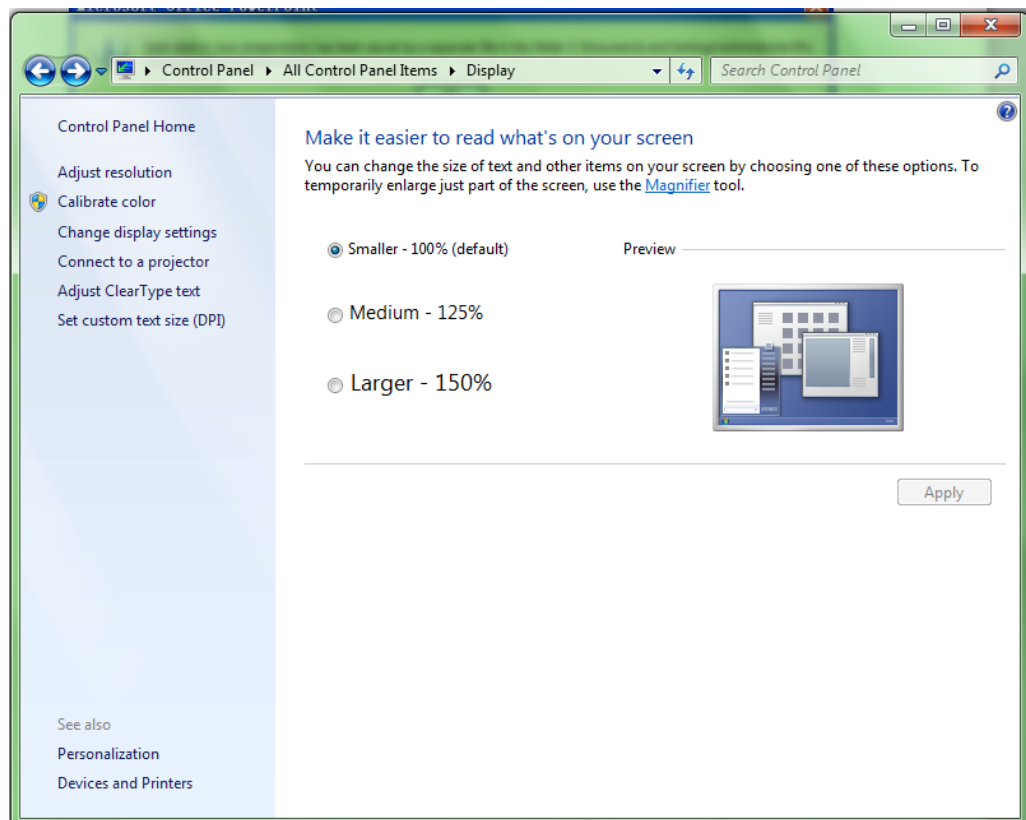
1. In PowerPoint 2010, open the presentation that you want to set as screensaver -> Click the **File Button** on the top left corner > point to "**Save As**" > Click "**Save As**" in the right column to bring up the window.
2. On the "**Save As**" window > Select an empty folder or create a new empty folder in which to save your presentation or slide > Modify the name in the "**File name**" box as you want > Choose "**Device Independent Bitmap (*.bmp)**" in the drop-down box of "**Save as type**" > Click "**Save**" button



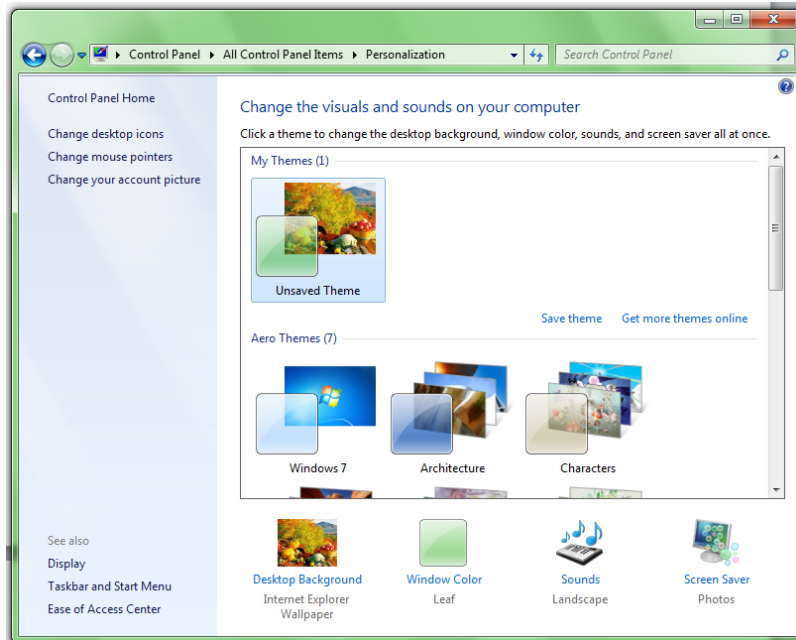
3. In the "Microsoft Office PowerPoint" dialog box > choose "**Every Slide**" or "**Current Slide Only**" as you want > Click "**OK**" in the next dialog box. This will create a file containing the pictures in bitmap format.



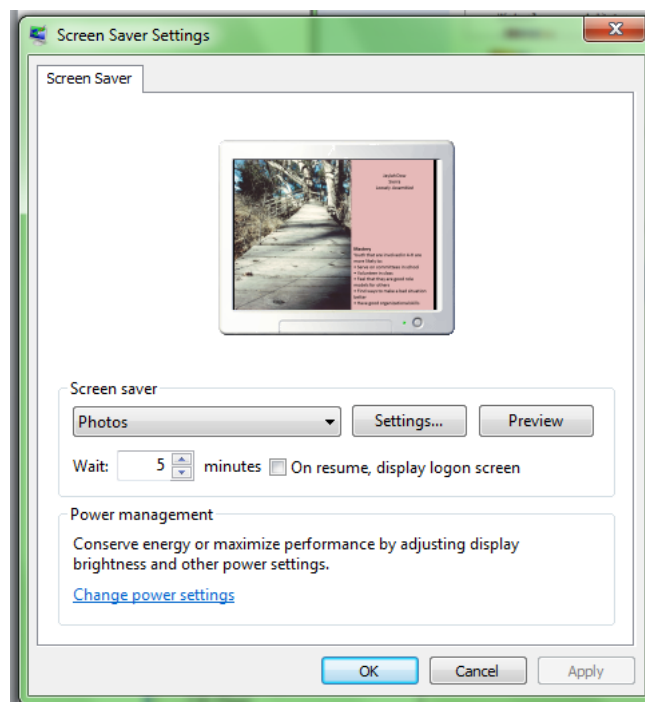
4. In Windows 2010, click "**Start**" > Click "**Control Panel**" > Click "**Display**", on the screen in the bottom left hand corner click personalization:



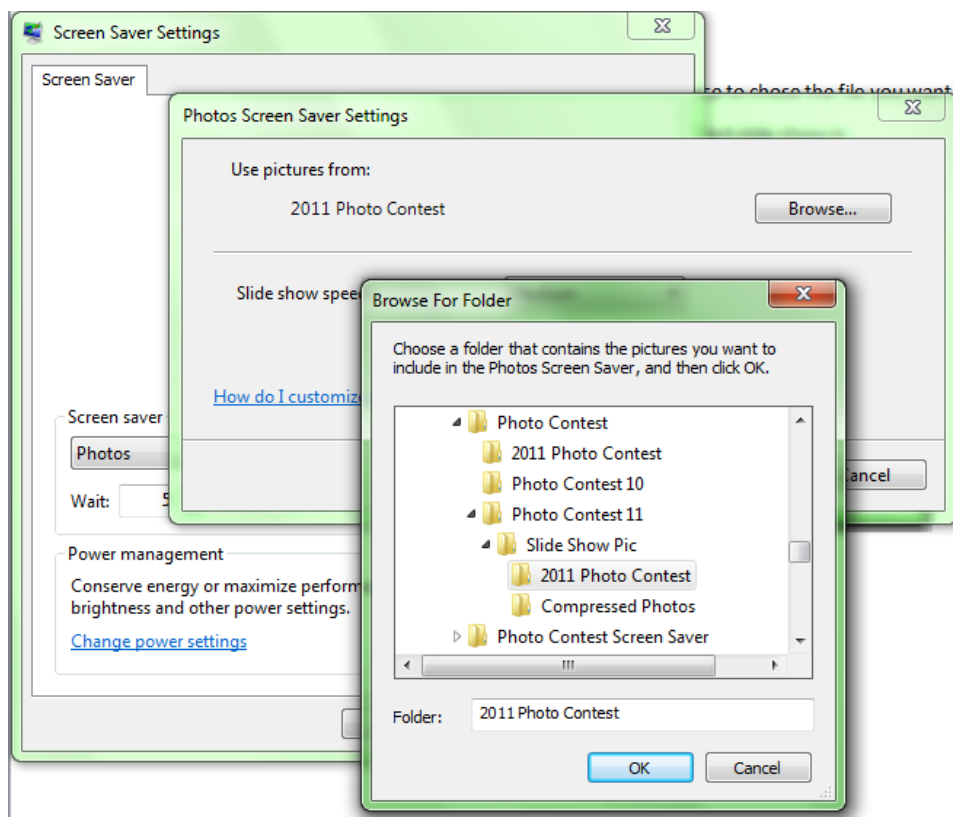
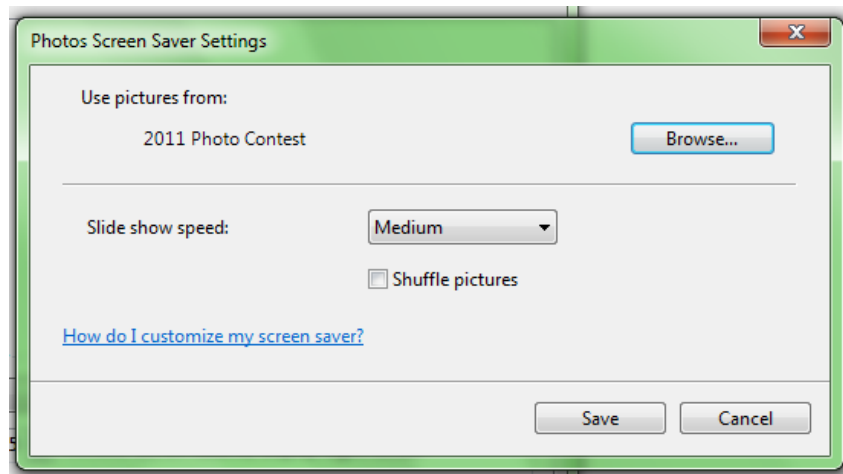
5. Once you have clicked on Personalization this screen will appear. On this screen you will want to click on Screen Saver option in the bottom right hand corner.



6. In the screen saver box you will want to click on the bar halfway down the screen under "Screen saver". A menu will drop down. In the menu chose "Photo's". Once "Photo's" is chose click on Settings.



7. When you click settings this screen will appear. Click on Browse to chose the file you want as your screen saver. You then chose the file that you saved the converted slide show in. Click ok and it will load that file in as your screen saver.



Now you can preview or wait for your wonderful screen saver from PowerPoint 2007.

Alternative way to create screensaver from PowerPoint with multimedia

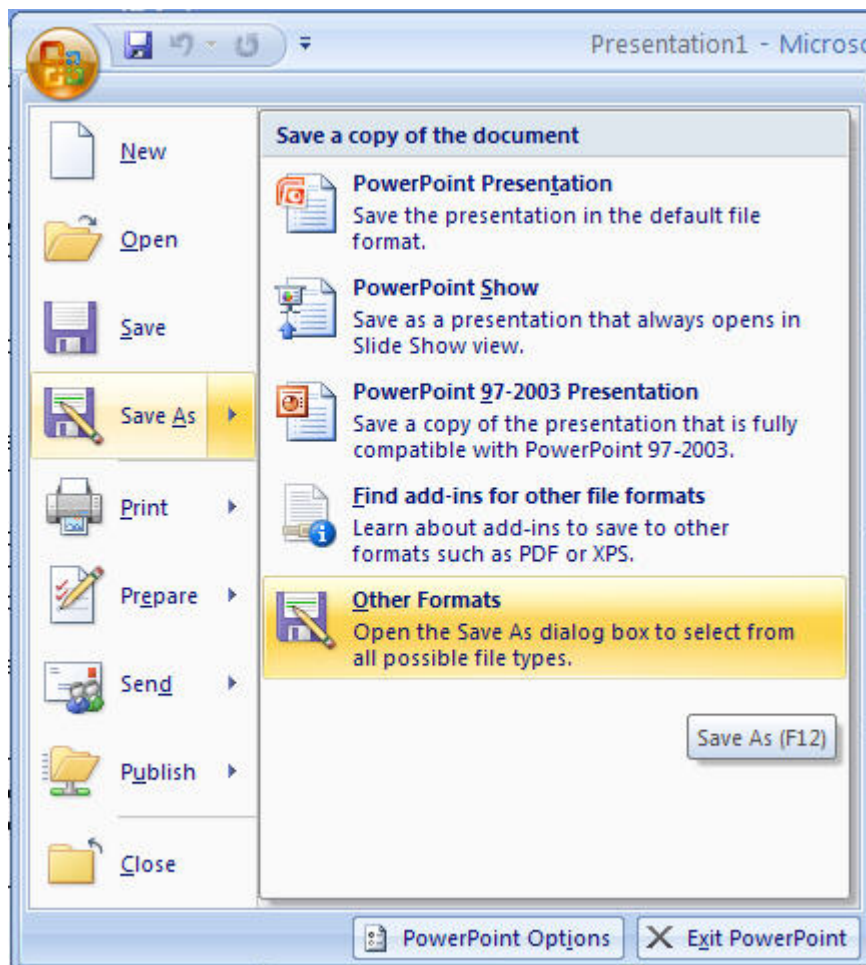

2. On the "**Save As**" window > Select an empty folder or create a new empty folder in which to save your presentation or slide > Modify the name in the "**File name**" box as you want > Choose "**Device Independent Bitmap (*.bmp)**" in the drop-down box of "**Save as type**" > Click "**Save**" button

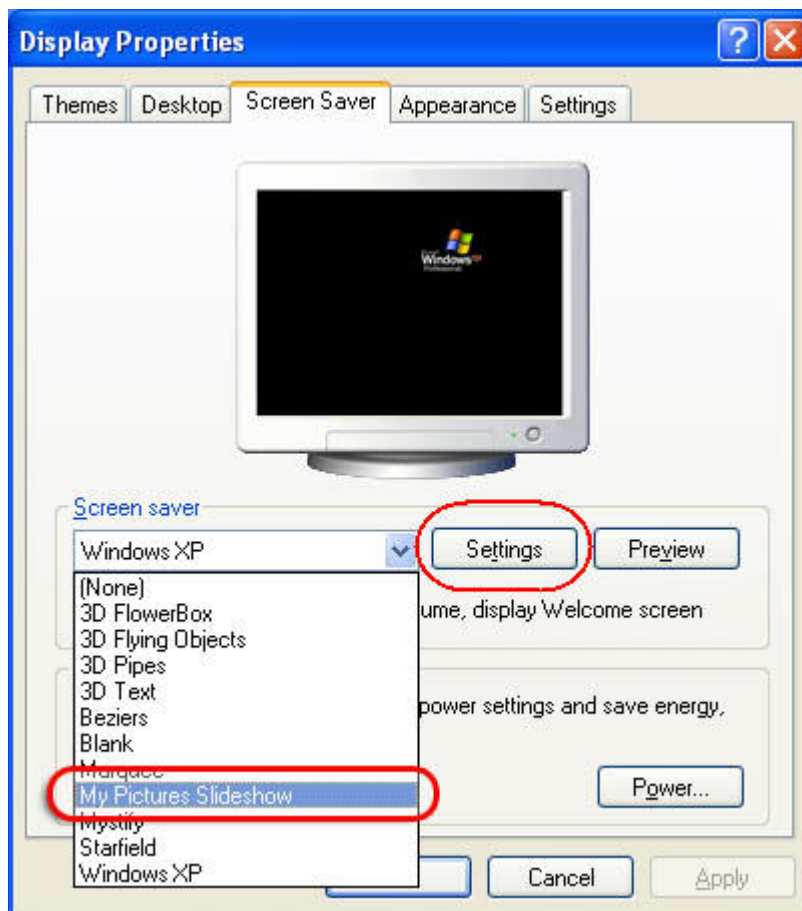


3. In the "Microsoft Office PowerPoint" dialog box > choose "**Every Slide**" or "**Current Slide Only**" as you want > Click "**OK**" in the next dialog box



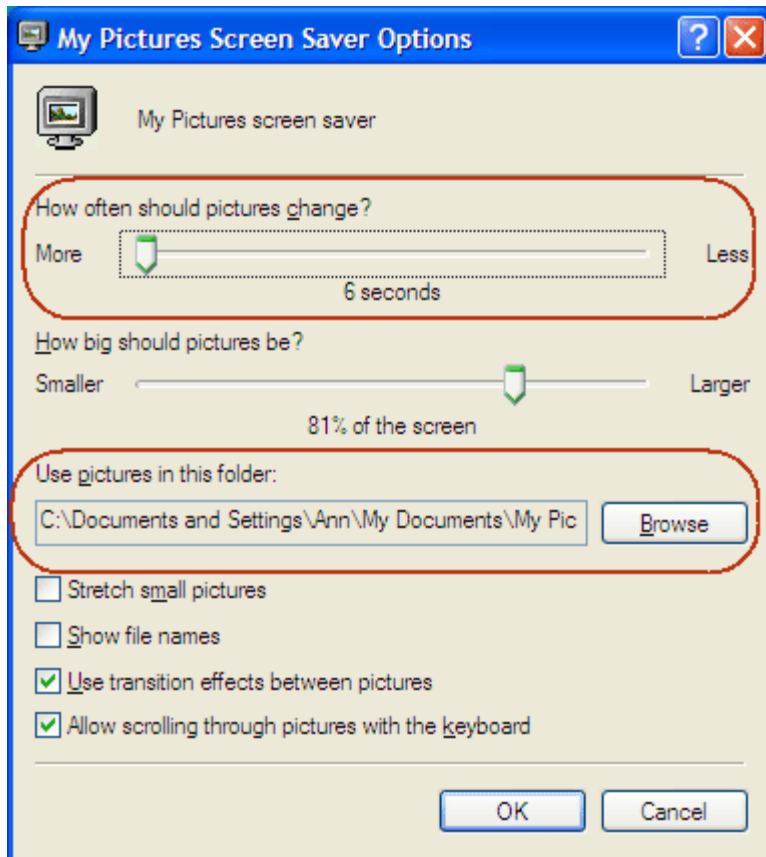
4. In Windows XP, click **"Start"** > Click **"Control Panel"** > Click **"Display"**, or click "Appearance and Themes", and then click "Display"

5. On the **"Display Properties"** window > click to **"Screen Saver"** tab > In the drop-down box of "Screen saver", choose **"My Pictures Slideshow"** > Set the amount of time in the "Wait" box as you want > Click the **"Settings"** button



6. On the **"My Pictures Screen Saver Options"** window > Under **"How often should pictures change?"**, set the slider at the interval as you want > Under **"How big should pictures be?"**, set the slider at the interval as you want >

Under "**Use pictures in this folder:**", browse to the folder in which you saved the presentation or slide > Click "OK" in the "My Pictures Screen Saver Options" window > Click "**OK**" or "**Apply**" in the "Display Properties" window



Now you can preview or wait for your wonderful screen saver from PowerPoint 2007.

Alternative way to create screensaver from PowerPoint with multimedia

How to Create Screensaver with PowerPoint 2000, 2002, 2003

Step 1: Save your slide or presentation as a .bmp file

1. Open the PowerPoint presentation. If you want to save a specific slide, select it in normal view.
2. On the **File** menu, click **Save As**.

Select an empty folder or create a new empty folder in which to save your presentation or slide.

Note If you use the **My Pictures** folder under **My Documents**, make sure it is empty.

3. In the **Save as type** box, click **Device Independent Bitmap**, and then click **Save**. You can keep the original presentation file name or create a new name.
4. Click **Every Slide** or **Current Slide Only**, and then click **OK**. (In PowerPoint 2000, click **Yes** to export every slide.)

Your presentation or slide is saved to the folder that you selected. After you close your PowerPoint presentation, you will use Windows XP to open the presentation or slide as a screen saver.

Note Animations that you may have added to the original presentation will not play when you create the screen saver.

5. Close your presentation.

Step 2: Create the screen saver

You must be running Windows XP to perform this procedure.

1. Click **Start**, click **Control Panel**, and then click **Display**, or click **Appearance and Themes**, and then click **Display**.
2. On the **Screen Saver** tab, click **My Pictures Slideshow**, and in the **Wait** box, set the amount of time you want to elapse before the screen saver is displayed.
3. Under **Screen saver**, click **Settings**.
4. Under **How often should pictures change?**, set the slider at the interval you want between pictures, or, if you are making a single slide a screen saver, move the slider to **Less** (three minutes) to avoid a distracting flicker on the screen during the transitions.
5. Under **Use pictures in this folder**, browse to the folder in which you saved the presentation or slide.
6. If you saved a single slide, clear the **Use transition effects between pictures** and **Allow scrolling through pictures with the keyboard** check boxes.

Note Remember the screen saver transition effects in this screen saver option are predesigned and do not include the transitions that you set when you created the presentation.

7. Click **OK**.
8. To preview your new screen saver, on the **Screen Saver** tab, click **Preview**
