## **March County College Week registration is open**

Registration is open for County College Week, March 23-27 at the NMSU Las Cruces campus. The 12-session, 24-class curriculum offerings include 10 classes from the Certified Public Official requirements list, making it a great opportunity to progress toward certification. A total of 22 classes from the CPM catalog are being offered during the 12 sessions. ## **On-line credit card use available for March registration**

For the first time, County College registration payment can be handled via secure on-line credit-/procurement-card use to expedite your registration.

## ***County College Week Pass gives you 12 classes for one price***

County College students can get the most out of the March County College Week by buying a *County College Week Pass* at the registration site. The *Pass* gives students access to all 12 sessions. A student attending 12 classes on the County College Week Pass will get a 45% discount. The *County College Week Pass* delivers a discount to anyone taking more than six classes. Those taking classes through their affiliates during March County College Week can be covered for those classes by their *County College Week Pass*.

## **One-time enrollment fee scholarship for first 30 new students**

The first 30 new students to register for a minimum of three classes on our on-line registration site for March County College Week will receive a scholarship to cover the one-time academic enrollment fee of \$50. The fee is covered by the New Mexico Mutual Casualty Company Scholarship.

## **Limited individual scholarships offered**

Individuals who would like to apply for individual scholarship support may apply by sending the following: 1) A statement of goals they seek to achieve through County College (certification, etc.) and; 2) a statement of what support they expect from their employer to attend County College classes. Send your application to [countycollege@nmsu.edu](mailto:countycollege@nmsu.edu) by Feb. 25. You must be a currently enrolled County College student to qualify. The scholarship is covered by the New Mexico Mutual Casualty Company.

## **Affiliates co-locating meetings with March County College Week**

## **June County College Day at NMAC Annual Meeting planned**

Six classes during three class session periods are planned for County College Day in June in Hobbs. Three classes from the Certified Public Official requirements list will be offered: CPM 111-- *Knowing your government*, CPM 113-- *Knowing the law I*, and CPM 139 – *Creating an ethical culture*. Three classes from the Certified Public Supervisor requirements list will be offered: CPM 132—*Eliminating discrimination in the workplace*, CPM 137—*Discipline and termination* and CPM 236 – *Successful supervision*. These CPS classes can also be used as electives toward a CPO designation. In addition, affiliates are already working with County College to arrange classes during affiliate sessions.

## **Student expectations outlined**

County College is subject to accreditation standards of the National Certified Public Manager Consortium and to standards expected for the awarding of NMSU Continuing Education Units. It is important that we assure that County College classes are quality learning experiences that warrant the awarding of credits toward certification. Students are expected to:

1. Sign in for class
2. Attend the entire class session
3. Complete assignments, including learning-measure tests

Students who do not do the above will not be awarded credit for the class. Students unable to fulfill these requirements on class days, should check in with the registration desk to arrange to apply their tuition fee to a future class.
