Six classes during three class session periods are planned for County College Day, June 2 in Hobbs at the Lea County Event Center. Classes are \$75 each.

Assessors to host three classes on June 2 and 3

In Hobbs, the Assessors' affiliate will offer two classes on June 2, County College Day, and one class during its affiliate session on June 3. The classes are all part of the New Mexico Certified Public Assessment Officer program adopted in March. The affiliate adopted a rigorous 26-class curriculum to earn the designation. Registrations for the classes are handled through the affiliate. The June offerings are as follows:

Other affiliates planning County College classes in Hobbs

Several affiliates are planning County College classes in Hobbs. On Wednesday morning, June 3, Clerks will host *CPM 123 Managing organizational change* and Treasurers tentatively plan to host *TO 101 Resources for county treasurers*, during their respective affiliate sessions.

Risk Managers, Human Resources and Detention Affiliates will jointly convene for the *CPM 144 Risk Management* class on Thursday afternoon, June 4, during their affiliate time.

Still other affiliates are exploring classes during their affiliate times.

Affiliates adopt certification plans

Four affiliates took steps during meetings at March County College Week in Las Cruces to adopt certification curricula specific to their members. The Assessors Affiliate, which held its spring meeting in conjunction with County College Week, adopted a rigorous 26-class curriculum to earn a New Mexico Certified Public Assessment Officer designation.

The Treasurers Affiliate Curriculum Committee conferred with New Mexico Treasurer James Lewis and adopted a 21-class curriculum. Those who complete the 21 classes, will earn a Certified New Mexico Treasury Official designation.

The Health Care Affiliate adopted an 18-class curriculum to earn a New Mexico Certified County Health Care Official designation, including five affiliate-specific classes and 13 selected CPM classes.
