Affiliates will meet in Socorro for County College Week

Assessors', Treasurers' and Clerks' affiliates will meet for fall meetings in Socorro the week of Sept. 14 to coincide with County College Week. Their meetings will feature the cross-listed class AO/TO/CL 201: *Rights and responsibilities of treasurers, assessors and clerks*, which will explore the interconnected work of the three offices in county government.

Commissioners, Managers, Emergency Managers and E911 addressers are invited to attend the 6-hour HS 111: *Preparing communities for agro-terrorism* on September 15 in Socorro, as well. They will qualify for support to attend from Homeland Security.

The entire Budgeting and Public Finance Track of CPM classes will be offered – CPM 141, 142, 143, 144, 145, 146, 241 and 242. Other CPM classes needed for CPO and CPS certifications, will be offered along with affiliate classes.

County College plans 10 class sessions between Monday afternoon and Friday noon. Students can buy a County College Week pass for \$450 for all 10 sessions, including affiliate classes. This will be a great chance to work toward completion of a CPO or for CPO graduates to work toward a CPS. Assessors, Treasurers and other affiliates will have classes for their specialized certificate programs, too.
