Six classes during three class session periods are planned for County College Day, June 2 in Hobbs at the Lea County Event Center. Classes are \$75 each.

20 classes announced for County College Week in Socorro

Assessors', Treasurers' and Clerks' affiliates will meet for fall meetings in Socorro the week of Sept. 14 to coincide with County College Week. Their meetings will feature the cross-listed class AO/TO/CL 201: *Rights and responsibilities of treasurers, assessors and clerks*, which will explore the interconnected work of the three offices in county government. Assessors will also host AO 116: *Administering special tax districts*.

Commissioners, Managers, Fire and Emergency Managers and E911 Addressers are invited to attend the 6-hour HS 111: *Preparing communities for agro-terrorism* on September 15 in Socorro, as well. They will qualify for support to attend from Homeland Security. Every county is encouraged to send a team.

The entire Budgeting and Public Finance Track of CPM classes will be offered – CPM 141, 142, 143, 144, 145, 146, 241 and 242. Other CPM classes to be offered include CPM 114, 123, 125, 124, 157, 159, 213, 222, and 224.

County College plans 11 class sessions between Monday afternoon and Friday noon. Students can buy a County College Week pass for \$450 for all sessions, including affiliate classes. That is less than \$41 per class. Individual CPM classes are \$75. The County college Week Pass is an excellent buy for anyone taking more than six classes.
