Descriptions of 64 Certified Public Manager courses are on line at the County College Web site. The listing makes up the courses needed to achieve certifications through County College. Specific course requirements to become a Certified Public Official, Certified Public Supervisor and Certified Public Manager are on line at the Web site, too. The courses and programs are based on standards used within the National Certified Public Manager Consortium.

New Mexico CPM program on active status in CPM Consortium

Official notification of active status to the New Mexico CPM program in the National Certified Public Manager Consortium came in a September 25 letter from the NCPMC administrator Jack Lemon. He acknowledged a unanimous vote of the NCPMC Board of Directors to grant active status to the CPM program: "This vote is a reflection of the Board's confidence that New Mexico will continue to develop its CPM program and as soon as ready will request an accreditation review."
