On-line registration for Socorro CC Week is robust

On-line registration for County College Week in Socorro, Sept. 14 -18, ended with 185 registrants taking an average of between five and six classes each. With walk-up registration for free classes and affiliate-sponsored classes expected to be high, well in excess of 200 students are expected for the week.

Walk-up registration still available for County College Week

Students who wish to register for classes for County College Week in Socorro, may do so at the County College registration desk on the second floor of the Fidel Center on the New Mexico Tech campus starting at 10 a.m. Monday, Sept. 14. Registration on-site requires a check or credit card, unless the class is free. Registration desks will be set up before classes at all locations, including the Macey Center and the County Annex. Those who register on-site will receive completion certificates by mail. Mileage and per diem for students of free Homeland Security classes could create last-minute walk-up registration. If you plan to attend these classes, plan to get there a little early, if possible.

Mileage and per diem available for County College students

There is still room for students in the Homeland Security classes in Socorro on Sept. 16 and 17, which are free. Attendees of *HS 111* and *HS 109* qualify for reimbursement of travel and per diem expenses. Teams from counties including commissioners, managers, emergency managers, finance personnel, safety officers, and E-911 personnel are encouraged to attend.
