The endowment is now \$500,000.00. Only the interest is paid out. Fifty-five (55) students now receive \$500.00 per year for four (4) years.

Coca-Cola Scholars Foundation: the company provides \$350,000.00 in scholarships to 150 students nationwide. As members, we meet in Atlanta, Georgia to select the top fifty (50) students.

Archdiocese Catholic Foundation: was formed by the Archbishop of Santa Fe to raise an endowment for church activities. Only the interest is used and depends primarily on raising funds through wills, estates, etc.

Manuel Lujan Insurance Agency: started by Manuel Lujan, Sr. in 1926 in Santa Fe, New Mexico. In 1965, I established a separate agency by the same name in Albuquerque. Today it is one of the largest insurance agencies in New Mexico.

New Mexico Real Estate Commission: I hold a broker's license primarily involved in brokering banks.
