4-H Understanding Preschool Children – Greentop

400.M-10 (R-18)



This project is designed for 9 to 12-year-old 4-H members to develop an understanding of young children. This can be used as an individual project or a club project when members do the activities together at club meetings. There are opportunities for leadership development, citizenship, exhibits, and demonstrations.

4-H Members Will Learn:

- How you feel about being with 3-5-year-old children (preschoolers).
- How to watch or observe children so you can understand how they act.
- How to use positive ways to help young children behave the way you want them to behave.
- How to comfort, feed, and play with young children.
- What toys are safe and unsafe for preschoolers.

What You Will Need To Do This Project:

- One or two children who are 3-5 years old that you can watch or observe and play with (with parents in the house)
- Old magazines, paste or glue, crayons, markers, paper
- Toys - safe and unsafe
- Deck of regular playing cards
- Lunch foods
- Washcloth and rubber band
