Students will spend time assisting the USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) field office staff in providing conservation planning and technical assistance to farmers, ranchers, other types of landowners, and local government officials. Students will learn about natural resource management strategies as NRCS technical specialists recommend ways to conserve soil, improve water quality and quantity, manage nutrients, and protect and improve wildlife habitat. You will interact with specialists such as conservation planners, agronomists, engineers, managers, and other NRCS staff. Students will also learn about and assist NRCS staff incorporate the various federal cost-share programs that provide financial assistance to help local producers implement conservation practices. To accomplish this, a combination of office and field work activities will be part of the internship experience.
