- 4-H Newsletter the 4-H newsletter comes in the mail every month. It includes upcoming events, dates and deadlines. This is your first go to for all things 4-H. We also post it on our website (we are in the process of switching over our site and will have it posted asap).
- 4-H Website our website is curryextension.nmsu.edu click on the 4-H Youth Development tab on the right. This page has resources, forms, links to state 4-H information and county 4-H newsletters.
- 4-H Facebook Page our Facebook page is NMSU Curry County 4-H (this is the official page and the only one we use there is an old one out there, but current info is on NMSU Curry County 4-H). This is a public page you do not have to have Facebook to use it it works like a website. This is the quickest way for us to get out reminders and updates without flooding your email. We also share information from State 4-H and other groups that are relevant to the 4-H program.
- 4-H Emails emails are sent with reminders and any updates we receive after the newsletter has been mailed. We also create emails specific to project areas and share links to resources as they become available. The email list is taken from the member email listed in ZSuites. If you are not receiving emails (several have gone out in the last two months), notify our office please check junk, spam and promotional folders. Be sure the email you enrolled with is one you check.
- 4-H Postcards we mail out postcards for club meetings and special events as requested. As with the newsletter, we have to have your current address, to a mailbox you check regularly for you to receive them.

Here is how you can communicate with us – we welcome questions and we are here to help you. With over 200 youth in the program, the only way we know you are facing challenges or not receiving the appropriate information is if you tell us. You can also reach out to your club leaders.

2023 Summer Workshop Schedule

Welding Workshop

Terry Whitener (Texico Ag Shop Instructor) will be offering a beginning welding workshop on June 26-27 from 9am-Noon each day. Youth will make the skill plate from the 4-H Welding Project over the two days – they will need to attend both days. This workshop is open to Junior and Senior 4-H members (those who just completed 6th grade and up) and will take place at the Texico Ag Shop (if youth need transportation assistance, please contact the Extension Office). Participants will need to:

- Wear jeans with no holes or frayed edges.
- Wear a long-sleeved shirt, preferably made of cotton.
- Either boots, or shoes made from leather. Other shoes may be worn as long as they have no artificial "mesh" on the top of the foot made from nylon or anything like that. Hot metal sparks can melt through footwear made from plastics.
- A hair tie if anyone has long hair. We will have welding gloves, welding helmets, safety glasses and all the tools they need.



- 1. The Junior Livestock Sale will be held at the Curry County Events Center, Friday, August 18 at 6:30 p.m. The meal will begin at 6:00 p.m.
- 2. Each exhibitor who has an animal qualified for the Junior Livestock Sale must notify their intentions to the department superintendent at a meeting Friday, August 18 at 9:30 a.m. in the Curry County Events Center.

*** All exhibitors are REQUIRED to turn in a W-9 prior to the Junior Livestock Sale. W-9s will be included in the packet at check-in.

3. The number of animals to sell from each species (Swine, Sheep, Goats, Beef Cattle and Dairy Heifers) will be determined on a percentage basis of exhibitors (70%) capped at 102 sale slots total. The meat rabbit and broiler pen will be sold through the Junior Livestock Sale and will be allotted 1 sale slot each. There must be a minimum of (7) 4-H/FFA Meat Pens in order to guarantee one sale slot and there must be a minimum of (7) 4-H/FFA Broiler Pens in order to guarantee one sale slot. All Sale slot will be rounded to the nearest whole number rounding down if the number is between a zero and 0.4 and rounding the whole number up if it is between 0.5 and 0.9. Each exhibitor may sell only one animal if more than one is eligible for the sale.

Accordingly, youth participate in summer and fall fair activities in the grade they just completed (exception: age for showmanship at the fair will be the age they are the day of show). These are standard grades based on public school general ages. Exceptions such as home or private schools or youth who have skipped a grade must be determined under the appropriate age.

Active Membership

Curry County 4-H members must maintain an "Active Membership" status prior to participation in State Shoot, 4-H Rodeo, County Contests, District and State Conference, or Junior Divisions of the Curry County Fair. An "active" member will be considered one who completes enrollment prior to March 1, attends four (4) or more regularly scheduled 4-H meetings. No more than two (2) meetings in any given month will count toward the membership requirement. Meetings count during the 4-H year which is October 1st through September 30th.
