Dates for the spring Shooting Sports Leader Certification in Central New Mexico is set for February 25-26, 2023 to try to catch everyone up and to allow for two certifications in a year. We will continue to use the online modules participants will need to complete prior to attending. Leaders can go to:

The online portion will cover items including history, introduction to 4-H shooting sports, creating high quality programs, and risk management and is now available online through Zing-books at a cost of \$20.00 to access that portion of the training. Enrollment is open from October 1 – March 1. The deadline to add projects is July 1.

4-H AGES for the 2022-2023 4-H Year

Age as of January 1, 2023 - the current 4-H Year (October- October)	5, 6, 7 – 8 year olds in the 2nd grade	8 year olds in the 3rd grade, 9 year olds, 10 year olds, 11 year olds in the 5th grade	11 year olds in the 6th grade; 12 year olds; 13 year olds in the 7th grade	13 year olds in the 8th grade; 14 year olds; 15 year olds; 16 year olds; 17 year olds; 18 year olds; Youth who are 19 by December 31 of the current 4-H year are not eligible to enroll as a 4-H member.

^{*}Grade as of January 1 of the current 4-H year (October-October). Accordingly, youth participate in summer and fall fair activities in the grade they just completed. These are standard grades based on public school general ages. Exceptions such as home or private schools or youth who have skipped a grade must be determined under the appropriate age.

Active Membership

Curry County 4-H members must maintain an "Active Membership" status prior to participation in 4-H Rodeo, County Contests, District and State Conference, or Junior Divisions of the Curry County Fair. An "active" member will be considered one who completes enrollment prior to March 1, attends four (4) or more regularly scheduled 4-H meetings. No more than two (2) meetings in any given month will count toward the membership requirement. Meetings count during the 4-H year which is October 1st through October 30th.

2023 County Fair Production Steer Class

We will again be offering the production steer class at the Curry County Fair. This specialized contest offers added money and awards. There is not a sale slot for the production steer, however, steers may be cross entered in a market class. Rules are available at the following link:

Initial weigh-in happens in January. If you are planning to exhibit a production steer or need more information, please contact Mason at the Extension Office prior to January $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$.

2022-2023 Enrollment

If you were a member of Curry County 4-H last year, you have a ZSuites account. It is under the primary email you used to enroll. Each family is created under a Household, so you can update all youth and volunteers in one account. Deadline for youth enrollment is March 1, however if youth want to attend events/workshops, they will need to complete enrollment asap. Visit https://4h.zsuite.org/

You will log in with your email and select reset password (or use 12345). Verify that contact information is correct, update clubs and projects, then submit enrollment for each individual. Provide a signed copy of the liability and medical release form to the Extension Office to complete enrollment. Enrollment will be pending until all documentation is received in the Extension Office.


If you do not have internet or phone access, you are welcome to come into the office to complete an online or paper enrollment form. Please contact us if you have questions.
