5. Click on the blue 'Reset All Course Progress for the New Year (Cannot be undone)'


6. Start Course

### 4-H Member Ages for the 2021/22 4-H Year

Novice: Age 9-11. A 4-H Member must have passed his/her 9<sup>th</sup> birthday or be 8 years old or in the 3<sup>rd</sup> grade, but not have passed his/her 12<sup>th</sup> birthday prior to January 1 of the current 4-H year.

**Junior:** Ages 12-13. A 4-H member must have passed his/her  $12^{\rm th}$  birthday or be 11 years old and in the  $6^{\rm th}$  grade, but not have passed his/her  $14^{\rm th}$  birthday party prior to January 1 of the current 4-h year.

**Senior:** Ages 14-19. A 4-H member must have passed his/her 14<sup>th</sup> birthday or be 13 years old and in the 8<sup>th</sup> grade but not have passed his/her 19<sup>th</sup> birthday prior to January 1 of the current 4-H year.

### <u>Curry County 4-H</u> <u>Membership Requirements</u>

4-H is open to ages 9-19. A youth must have passed their  $9^{\text{th}}$  birthday, but not their  $19^{\text{th}}$  birthday prior to January  $1^{\text{st}}$  of the current 4-H year to be considered eligible for membership.

Curry County 4-H members must maintain an "Active Membership" status prior to participation in 4-H Rodeo, County Contests, District and State Conference, or Junior Divisions of the Curry County Fair. An "active" member will be considered one who attends four (4) or more regularly scheduled meetings. Not more than two (2) meetings in any given month will count toward the membership requirement. Meetings count during the 4-H year which is October 1st through September 30<sup>th</sup>. The intent of this rule is not to punish inactive members, but rather to reward active members. Therefore, every effort should be made to provide opportunities for members to obtain an "active" status. 4-H Council officers cannot miss over seven (7) regular Council Meetings and retain that office.
