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

Instructions for Online Enrollment

Enrollment closes March 1! New Mexico 4-H has changed to a brand new enrollment system called ZSuites that will offer online enrollment. This means that each family will log on and create an account, and complete enrollments online. Adult volunteers, you have already used ZSuites to complete the annual working with minors training. Therefore, you do not need to create a new account; you can work off of your existing account- you will log in with your email, and if you can't remember your password, just reset it. Members can re-enroll through a paper copy also. Leaders, we will need hard copies of the liabilities and the Disclosure and Consent Forms. Please get enrolled ASAP so we have time to fix it if there are any difficulties.

To enroll:

- 1. Visit https://4h.zsuite.org/ you can use any browser, but I have found the google chrome works the best
- 2. If you have never used zsuites before, start by creating a new account. If you have an existing zsuite account, log in with your username and password.

- **Zsuites works off of "households," which means you will only create one account for your entire family**
- 3. Add household members for each of your youth needing to be enrolled as well as any adults in your household who will be enrolling as volunteers or club leaders (i.e., your spouse)

- 4. Enroll each youth and adult volunteer

Make sure to download the medical form, fill it out, and then re-upload it to each household member's accounts. You will not be approved on the county level until those forms are attached to your enrollment.

**Adults enrolling will need to enroll as volunteers, NOT as the club leader, unless you are the primary club leader for that particular club

5. Once you have completed enrollments, you will be approved by us on our end

Required Volunteer Training

All 4-H volunteers are required to complete a "Working With Minors" training for the new 4-H year. You are not a certified volunteer until this training is completed annually.

Please complete the training ASAP online. The training is now available on ZSuite. Go to 4h.zsuite.org to complete the training. Once logged in...

4-H Member Ages for the 2021/22 4-H Year

Novice: Age 9-11. A 4-H Member must have passed his/her 9th birthday or be 8 years old or in the 3rd grade, but not have passed his/her 12th birthday prior to January 1 of the current 4-H year.

Junior: Ages 12-13. A 4-H member must have passed his/her $12^{\rm th}$ birthday or be 11 years old and in the $6^{\rm th}$ grade, but not have passed his/her $14^{\rm th}$ birthday party prior to January 1 of the current 4-h year.

Senior: Ages 14-19. A 4-H member must have passed his/her 14th birthday or be 13 years old and in the 8th grade but not have passed his/her 19th birthday prior to January 1 of the current 4-H year.

<u>Curry County 4-H</u> <u>Membership Requirements</u>

4-H is open to ages 9-19. A youth must have passed their 9^{th} birthday, but not their 19^{th} birthday prior to January 1^{st} of the current 4-H year to be considered eligible for membership.

Curry County 4-H members must maintain an "Active Membership" status prior to participation in 4-H Rodeo, County Contests, District and State Conference, or Junior Divisions of the Curry County Fair. An "active" member will be considered one who attends four (4) or more regularly scheduled meetings. Not more than two (2) meetings in any given month will count toward the membership requirement. Meetings count during the 4-H year which is October 1st through September 30th. The intent of this rule is not to punish inactive members, but rather to reward active members. Therefore, every effort should be made to provide opportunities for members to obtain an "active" status. 4-H Council officers cannot miss over seven (7) regular Council Meetings and retain that office.
