
May is here! School is almost out and summer activities are about to begin! We hope to see tons of 4-H members this summer.

Summer Judging

In order to qualify for District (novice and junior) or State (senior) level competition, members must attend at least one practice. The county contest for this year will be conducted throughout the practice sessions. Some component of the contest will be scored during each practice (id practice, judging class, etc.). Scores will be totaled for county awards. Should the number of youth participating exceed the number of youth our county is allowed at the District or State level, practice scores will determine eligibility (the highest scoring youth will be eligible to move forward). If you would like to participate in a contest that does not currently have practices scheduled or you are unable to attend the scheduled practices, please contact Halee to make arrangements to qualify.

Curry County 4-H Sweepstakes Award

The Sweepstakes Award is an achievement award available to 4-H members in recognition of participation in the 4-H Indoor Projects at the Curry County Fair. A member is eligible to winner as a Novice, Junior or Senior member, however, they may only win once in their 4-H career. Sponsors provide award funding annually. All funds contributed to the Sweepstakes Award go to the winner (this will not be less than \$500, but could be more depending on sponsorships). Any member wishing to compete for the Sweepstakes Award must declare his/her intent to the County Extension Office by May 1. Members who do not declare by the deadline, will not be eligible in that year. In order to be eligible, a member must enter at least 45 exhibits in the 4-H Division. Of these, at least 15 must be in the 4-H Project section (meaning they must be enrolled in the appropriate projects to exhibit). The remainder can be any combination of project and open 4-H exhibits. The winner will be determined by points (points will be awarded based on placings and shall be cumulative for all exhibits entered in the 4-H Division by the exhibitor). 4-H Member Ages for the 2021/22 4-H Year

Novice: Age 9-11. A 4-H Member must have passed his/her 9^{th} birthday or be 8 years old or in the 3^{rd} grade, but not have passed his/her 12^{th} birthday prior to January 1 of the current 4-H year.

Junior: Ages 12-13. A 4-H member must have passed his/her 12^{th} birthday or be 11 years old and in the 6^{th} grade, but not have passed his/her 14^{th} birthday party prior to January 1 of the current 4-h year.

Senior: Ages 14-19. A 4-H member must have passed his/her 14th birthday or be 13 years old and in the 8th grade but not have passed his/her 19th birthday prior to January 1 of the current 4-H year.

<u>Curry County 4-H</u> <u>Membership Requirements</u>

4-H is open to ages 9-19. A youth must have passed their 9th birthday, but not their 19th birthday prior to January 1st of the current 4-H year to be considered eligible for membership.

Curry County 4-H members must maintain an "Active Membership" status prior to participation in 4-H Rodeo, County Contests, District and State Conference, or Junior Divisions of the Curry County Fair. An "active" member will be considered one who attends four (4) or more regularly scheduled meetings. No more than two (2) meetings in any given month will count toward the membership requirement. Meetings count during the 4-H year which is October 1^{st} through September 30th. The intent of this rule is not to punish inactive members, but rather to reward active members. Therefore, every effort should be made to provide opportunities for members to obtain an "active" status. 4-H Council officers are allowed one excused absence from Council meetings during their terms. The extension office has the right to oversee the offices and remove an officers if he/she is not actively participating.
