Enrolled in a Livestock 4-H Project?

Planning to Exhibit your 4-H Project Animal?

Livestock exhibitors are required to attend the designated tagging dates and to complete a Livestock Nomination Certificate to designate their project animals. 4-H Leaders and FFA advisors will be asked to sign the completed certificates after the tagging to complete the nomination process. In the months leading up to the County Fair, exhibitors will be asked to complete an entry form confirming show intentions and identifying the number of livestock pens needed.

NO animals will be tagged outside of specified dates or off site.

Exhibitor need not be present at tagging, as long as, proper paperwork is completed and sent with designated representative.

Tags will cost \$3.50

Tag Replacement pricing: 1st replacement \$3.50;

2nd and beyond \$4.

Enrolled in the 4-H Rodeo Project?

By State Rodeo Rules, all contestants must have personal accident insurance and a signed and completed rodeo waiver in the State 4-H Office 15 days prior to the participant's first rodeo of the current year in order for the member to compete in Sanctioned 4-H Rodeos.

This includes the completion of the rodeo safety course.

If hauling, obtain hauling certificate.

What Is Summer Slide?

Summer slide is a learning loss that happens when your child doesn't use, or practice skills learned at school during summer break and returns to school at a lower academic level than the end of last year.

Summer Slide Facts

- The equivalent of **one month** of learning is lost
- **2.6 months** of math skills are lost
- **2 months** of reading are lost
- Takes **6 weeks** of re-learning in the fall

The good news: it only takes **2-3 hours** of practice per week to prevent summer learning loss.

Activities for Your Summer Learner?

Start by focusing on areas your student struggled with during the school year. Keeping it fun yet effective is important. With summer right around the corner, start planning learning activities now to avoid summer learning loss.

Become A Bookworm

Studies show reading four-to-five books over the summer is comparable to summer school enrolment. Summer allows your student to choose books that spark interest and excitement, making reading a fun and engaging summer activity.

Ways to incorporate reading into your summer plans:

- Take a trip to your local library
- Have them read in the morning before daily distractions
- Create a reward system for finishing books and/or chapters

Get Techy

Technology offers many opportunities to engage and enhance summer learning and promote essential skills including problem-solving and critical thinking.

Ways to incorporate technology into your summer plans:

- Challenge your child to a new high score on an educational app
- Start a tech project together—such as robotics
- Encourage drawing or creating art on tech devices
