

The event begins with taking entries at 12:30.

Scantrons will be used if you want to advise kids to bring pencils, clipboards and paper for reasons. Contestants are entered as individuals only – no teams.

There will be novice, junior and senior divisions. Seniors will give three sets of reasons. Awards will include four buckles and thirty jackets. A buckle will be awarded to the high individual in each of the three age divisions and a high reasons in the senior division. Jackets will be awarded to the top ten in each age group.

4-H Member Ages For 2022-2023 4-H Year

CLOVERBUDS: 5 to 8, years old AND in Kindergarten, 1st or 2nd grade (Born in 2015, 2016, or 2017)

NOVICE: 9 to 11 years old or 8 years old AND in the 3rd grade. (Born in 2012, 2013, 2014 OR born in 2015 AND in 3rd grade)

JUNIOR: 12 and 13 years old or 11 years old AND in 6th grade. (Born in 2010, 2011 or born in 2012 AND in the 6th grade) SENIOR: 14 to 18 years old or 13 years old AND in 8th grade (Born in 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009 or born 2010 AND in 8th grade)

Youth who are 19 as of January 1st of the current 4-H year (2023) are NOT eligible to enroll as a 4-H member. If you were born in 2004 or before, you are too old for the 2022-2023 4-H year. BUT, we would love to have you as a leader/volunteer!

4-H Cloverbud Participation

PURPOSE OF THE CLOVERBUD PROGRAM:

The overall purpose of the 4-H Cloverbud program is to foster the development of life skills that are essential for the cognitive, social, emotional, and physical maturation of kindergarten through 2nd graders by providing a unique educational opportunity. Children in these grades are a distinct audience for 4-H, with unique learning characteristics and developmental needs that are different from older children and youth served through 4-H membership. As a result, the 4-H Cloverbuds program is designed with specific educational objectives and program policies focused on the kindergarten-2nd grade child.

2022 4-H STEM Challenge

Designed by Rutgers University, Explorers of the Deep, focuses on the mysteries and adventures of ocean exploration—with robots! Young people learn how to use science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) to explore Earth's Ocean and how it relates to all life on the planet. The 2022 Challenge helps young people develop observational and critical thinking skills while exploring the interconnected nature between the ocean and humans, regardless of where they live. New Mexico 4-H Policy and Procedure Handbook **CLUBMEMBERSHIP COMPLETIONREQUIREMENTS**

To assure a degree of uniformity, the following statewide club completion requirements have been established for Novice, Junior and Senior members. Each requirement pertains to the current 4-H program year. All requirements must be enforced uniformly.

- 1. A member shall attend at least 40% of all club meetings and activities (Clubs may require up to 50%).
- 2. A member shall be involved in at least one leadership experience at the club or county level such as giving a demonstration or illustrated talk or public speech, or serving on a committee, or as a club or county officer, or as a junior or teen leader.
- 3. A member shall be involved in at least one citizenship activity to help others.
- 4. A member may complete record sheets in accordance with their abilities to receive a completion pin. (Completion requirements are to be determined by club leaders and /or Extension agents in the members' county.
- 5. Project award pins should be based on record book completion.

The above are minimum statewide requirements for the club members in the 4-H Youth Development Program.

Local clubs and/or county programs have the right to establish and enforce more stringent policies, which must be in writing and approved by the local County 4-H Council.
