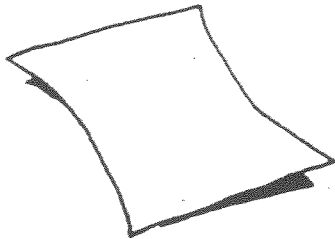

Up, Up and Away!

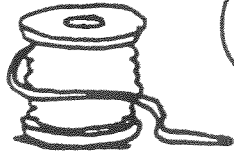
You need:



1 sheet of paper
8 1/2" x 11"

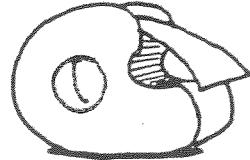


drinking
straw

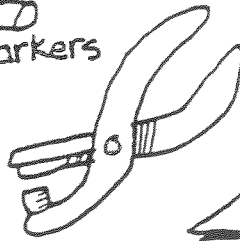


polyester thread

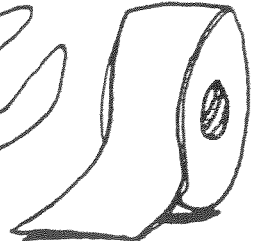
crayons or markers



tape





paper
punch




crepe paper


You do:


1. Fold the paper in half the short way. 



2. Fold the folded edge over the rest of the paper in both directions so it looks like this. 

3. Decorate with crayons or markers.

4. Turn the kite over and tape across the fold at one end. Tape the drinking straw across the other end. 

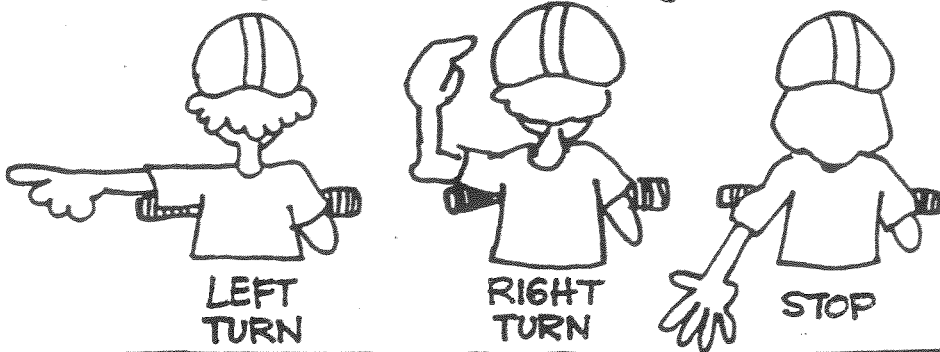
5. Place a piece of tape across the fold on the other side of the kite 1/2" from the front (straw end) on the folded margin. Punch a hole through the tape and paper. 

6.  Push the end of your thread through the hole and tie three or four knots to hold the thread.

7.  Tape colorful streamers to the bottom of your kite and you're ready to fly! 

Steer clear With hand signals!

According to the law, a bicycle rider must use the left arm to signal when turning or stopping.

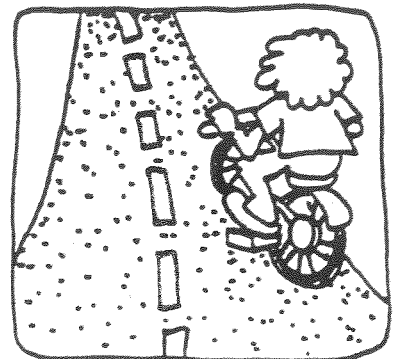
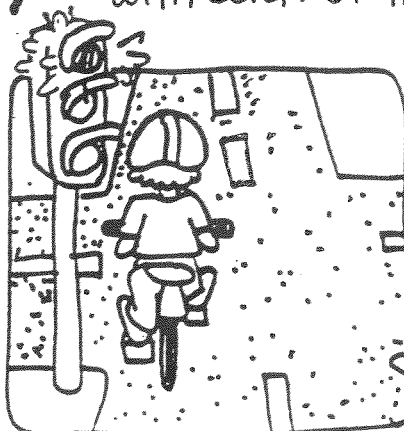
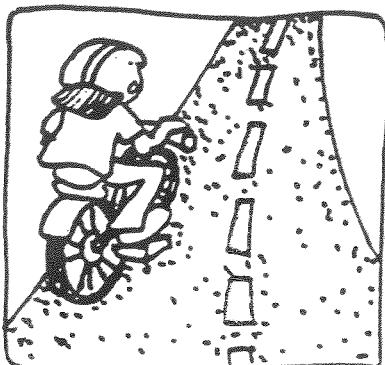

Walking Paper Horse Template

This page makes three (3) horses.

1. Cut out the three rectangle shapes
2. Cut along dotted lines to create the legs, head and tail, then cut along dotted line of each leg.
3. Fold down legs on blue line, and then fold up head and tail on blue line.
4. Cut on dotted lines to make ears and a nose, then fold tabs up to make ears.

For best results, use construction paper or cardstock.
